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## Guidance for Authors

### Articles

Notes and Records publishes original research in the history of science, technology and medicine.

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Notes should be typed separately from the main body of the manuscript. The Notes are printed at the end of each paper in numerical order, reference being made in the text by the use of superscript numbers.

Reference to books should include the author's name and initials, title (underlined for italics), then in brackets, town of origin and publisher (where appropriate for recent publications) and year of publication. Reference to papers in journals should include the author's name and initials, title of the paper, title of the journal (abbreviated according to common practice and underlined to indicate italics), volume number, the numbers of the first and last pages and the year of publication (in brackets). Examples are:
